I wish you all a restful and enjoyable break.

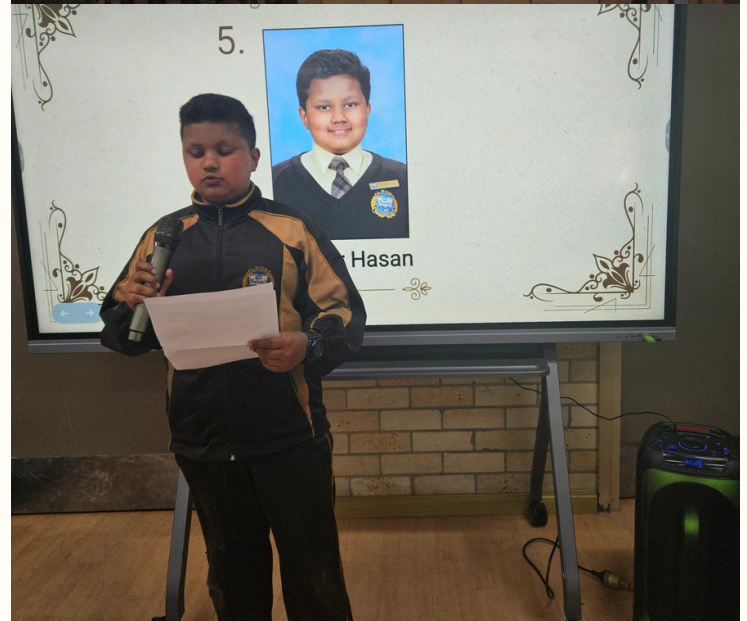

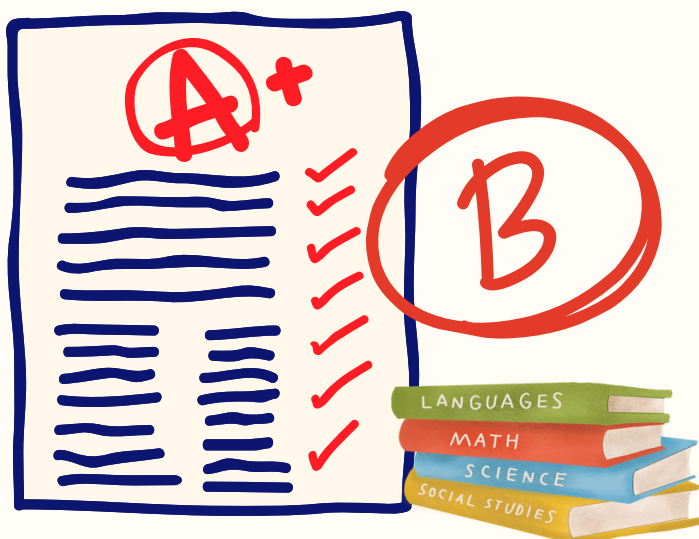




SEMESTER 2 REPORTS

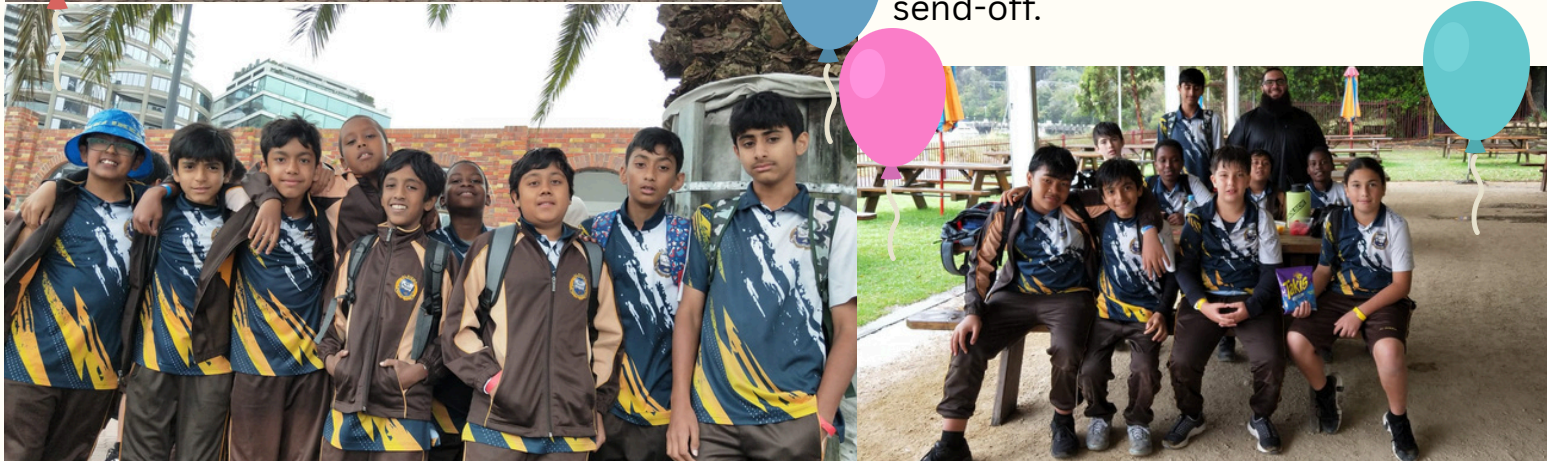

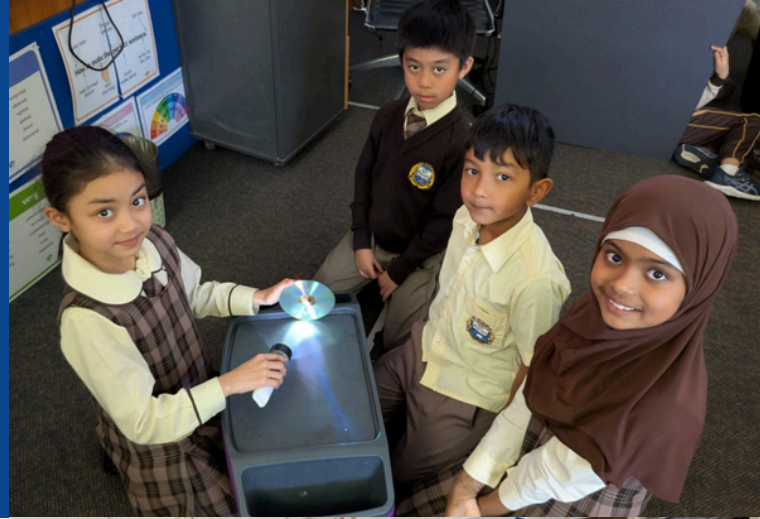
Smiles, Science, and Special Memories: Term 4 in 2R

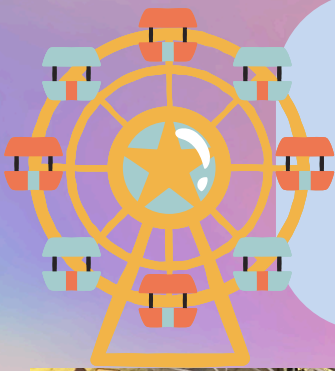

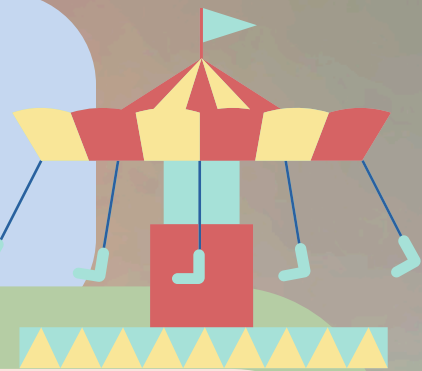
